All reliever inhalers are easily accessible. All pupils with asthma/suspected asthma know where their inhaler is at all times.		
We have an emergency reliever inhaler to be used in accordance with guidance (optional). All staff will know where this is kept.		/
Our staff have appropriate asthma training and updates and will know how to recognise and what to do in an asthma attack.		
We understand an asthma attack is a medical emergency and will call 999 if symptoms are not improving or we are worried about the child at any point.		
We are committed to promoting an environment that is safe for pupils/students with asthma.		✓
We provide support to pupils/students who are missing school due to their asthma.		/
